


FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE

CONSIDERATIONS:

- FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE (FMD) IS A VIRAL DISEASE THAT AFFECTS ANIMALS WITH CLOVEN HOOVES/ TWO TOES SUCH AS PIGS, CATTLE, SHEEP, AND GOATS.
- PEOPLE CANNOT BECOME SICK FROM THIS VIRUS, SO IT IS SAFE FOR CARETAKERS TO INTERACT WITH THE PIGS AND THE MEAT IS SAFE TO EAT.
- DISEASES SUCH AS SENECAVIRUS A (SVA) CAN PRODUCE SIMILAR CLINICAL SIGNS.


TEMPERATURES HIGHER THAN 102.0°F (38.9°C)
